It also raises key questions for further consideration and points to critical next steps that will help to promote its safe integration into our classroom practice. Debates about the influence of artificial intelligence (AI) on all aspects of human life have intensified, particularly with advancements in conversational AI from late 2022 onwards. These rapidly developing technologies offer immediate – and longer term – opportunities, challenges, and threats to educational systems (UNESCO, 2023).

However, when it comes to integrating artificial intelligence into education, the current research and guidelines are limited and there is a pressing need for more comprehensive investigation into these matters. This publication was commissioned by the British Council to contribute to emerging research specifically around the impact of AI on English language teaching in education systems. This report examines three sources of evidence. First, a systematic review of the last 10 years of research on AI in ELT, taking us into early 2024. It then looks to the field, capturing the views of people impacted by these AI technologies. In the global teacher survey, 1,348 teachers from 118 countries and territories reveal how they are using AI and how they feel about the changes it's bringing. Finally, 19 key witnesses – stakeholders from South and East Asia, Sub-Saharan Africa, the EU and the UK – tell us their views.
